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“ A tribute to my American Mom - Carolyn Ware

Dear Mom,

We first met back in the fall of 1983. We had known each other for the past 37 years. I still remembered the first time that I met you and the Ware family. Your bright smiles and warm welcome really touched my heart.

You had taught me a lot of wonderful lessons in life. The first lesson that I have learned from you is kindness. I was a foreign student from Hong Kong, and I had nothing to offer, but you and your family still took me in. Carlton even volunteered to be my roommate at Holmes because he knew that I needed an interpreter. He understood my Chinglish, and I understood his English. We became good buddies, and He invited me to come to your home to spend a Thanksgiving break with your family. That was the first time that we met. Carlton was very kind to me, and he eventually became my official interpreter at Holmes. You definitely taught him well because he is kind to others just like you.

The second lesson that I have learned from you is generosity. You were a person that loved to give. You loved to give to God and to others. I remembered when I asked you, “Mom, how can I repay you for your generosity?” Your answer gave me a lasting impact in my life. You said, “Tim, you do not have to repay me. But later on when you are able to help others, help those students from Hong Kong or China. When you help those Chinese students and your people, that is the time that you repay me.” What a profound statement! Mom, I just want to tell you that I have taken your words seriously in my heart, and I have been helping my people from Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Mainland China through my ministry. When Sue and I got married, you were the one who coordinated everything for us so that we would have a memorable wedding. Your generosity and kindness really touched our hearts. Almost every year, you would baked a cake for us before Thanksgiving and mailed it to us. You remembered our birthdays and wedding anniversaries, and you would send us cards and monetary gifts to brighten our lives.

The third lesson that I have learned from you is godliness. You loved to talk about the Lord. You loved to sing songs to the Lord. You loved to pray. You loved to composed songs, and many times that you would call me up and sing those new songs to me

on the phone. I am convinced that you are singing with millions now in heaven, praising and thanking our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. I know you prayed for everyone of us everyday in your prayers. Your godliness became your character and your way of life.

There are so many lessons that I have learned from you, and I just cannot list them all out. I had to record a sermon today to get it ready for this Sunday. What you had done for me is grace upon grace. May our Lord reward you richly in heaven, calling you, "Well done, my good and faithful servant, come and share your master's happiness!"
