Nancy Buntin Jennings, age 96, passed away peacefully at Roman Eagle Rehabilitation and Health Care Center on Tuesday, January 9, 2018.

She was a wonderful mother to her four children and “Mama J” loved her five grandchildren and her seven great grandchildren.

Born to Juanita Ballow Buntin and Archer Green Buntin on August 16, 1921 in South Boston, VA. Nancy was married to James Lowell Jennings on August 7, 1939. Lowell predeceased her on Oct. 6, 1991 after 54 years of marriage.

She is also predeceased by one of her beloved sons, Robert Lee Jennings, who died on July 7, 2014.

Nancy was a wonderful mother and homemaker, sewing, cooking, and canning. She loved playing golf, playing bridge, working puzzles, and reading. She worked at Virginia Carolina Tobacco Warehouse in the offices along with her husband for many years and at the age of 56, she became a U.S. Mail carrier. She carried the mail in the Danville Mall and later had a rural mail route. She retired from that after eleven years.

She was always kind, strong, and willing to do whatever she could do to help family members and friends. She was always ready to travel and see new places, spending a month in Europe touring with her husband, Lowell and son Stuart when he was stationed there in the Air Force. In addition, she loved taking a trip out to the Western U.S. with her son Jim and wife Ann.

She was loved by her children and will be missed so very much.
