Alma Giles Dodson Pritchett Wood, 91, formerly of 790 Mt. Cross Rd., Danville, VA died on Thurs., Nov. 16, 2017 at Roman Eagle Rehabilitation and Health Care Center after being in declining health for the past few months.

Mrs. Wood was born in Danville, VA on August 29, 1926, daughter of the late William Thomas Dodson and Lula Austin Dodson. She spent all of her life in the Danville area where she was part owner and operator of the Kettle Restaurant. She was of the Baptist faith.
