Andrea Beth Bacon Boles of North Topsail Beach, NC, formerly of Danville, passed away Tuesday morning, May 11, 2010, at Duke University Medical Center, surrounded by family after a brief illness. Beth was born in Roanoke, Va., November 20, 1952. She was the daughter of the late Col. Layton Percy Bacon and the late Evelyn Virginia Bacon of Danville. She was the granddaughter of the late Albert Sidney Bacon and Bertie Lanier Bacon of Pembroke, Ga. She was a 1970 graduate of George Washington High School and attended Brenau College, Gainesville, Georgia. She was married to her husband, Julius Mauvison Boles on December 6, 1975.
