August 30, 1921 - February 24, 2011

Arnie Ester Cox, 89, of 205 Jeanette Drive, died, Thursday, February 24, 2011, at Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital Greensboro, N.C., after a decline in health for the past three months. Mr. Cox was born on August 30, 1921, the son of late Taylor Woodson Cox and Grace Pruitte.
