“ I was introduced to Barry in 1983 at Road and Track Imports, his repair shop in Danville. He had raced and maintained FFs in Indiana, worked late into the night to finish jobs, traveled to Sports Car Club of America events to crew for my hillclimb and time trial competitions. He taught me how to drive faster by braking later, dumping the clutch at the startline of hillclimbs and when my car was running horribly at Charlotte Motor Speedway, I called him on a payphone and he correctly diagnosed the problem as a loose carburetor jet. When my tow vehicle would break down and he was not with me, he always tried to help by phone. When I first worked with Barry, I tried to save him money (seriously) by telling him that I got along for 26 years with an adjustable wrench and if he relied on one, he'd save a lot of money on all of his expensive snap on wrenches. My first race car did not come with a reverse gear. It was annoying, especially at hillclimbs to ask for strangers or crew to push me backwards into my pit. When Barry installed my reverse gear late one night, and I was able to go backwards on my own, I yelled at the top of my lungs with joy. He then scared me that night by testing the other gears by driving my racecar down Elizabeth Street in total darkness without a light. When he returned, we got a good laugh when he shared that a drunk on the nearby golf course stumbled onto the street and was wide eyed terrified, probably thinking he hallucinating. On my birthday in 1988, he was co-driving my car and totaled my Lotus formula ford on turn twelve at Road Atlanta when he drifted off the road when the CV axle broke throwing the car into the guardrail. Three corners were torn off and they put a tent over him and cut him out of the car with the jaws of life and he was transported to the ER. Luckily, we had just put in new seatbelts and seat padding before that event. He was not injured but real sore and slept in the back of my van all the way home. He purchased my next Elden Formula Ford race car as he always made good on his promises. He was an excellent race car driver who competed in his Crossle formula ford (I only beat him twice) and before I met him he successfully raced a two liter Ford Capri sedan in regional races. We stayed in touch when I moved to Gainesville, FL in 1989 and raced together many times. One of my

last racing goals was to beat a ten minute lap time on the former German Gran Prix track called the Nurburgring. A former Triad Sports Car Club member, Mike Landreth, told me he got a ten minute lap there. He worked for Lorillard Tobacco and traveled to Germany to fix cigarette machines and would race commercial rental sedans and turn them in with no brakes and worn out tires. For the last three summers, I tried to take Barry to Nurburgring to drive the track. Each year, he was too ill to go and two years ago, I had already purchased his airline ticket when he called me to tell me his pacemaker defibrillator shocked his heart and he had to cancel. It was bittersweet when on August 8 of this year, I finally got a lap of 9:33 with a caution included. Janice, his sister, was so amazing in her caring for Barry as his health declined over the last few years I felt honored to be beside him in hospice last Sunday when he took his last breath. I witnessed Barry become a devout Christian and awesome grandfather and I will miss him dearly. Heaven has a new resident. God Bless Barry.

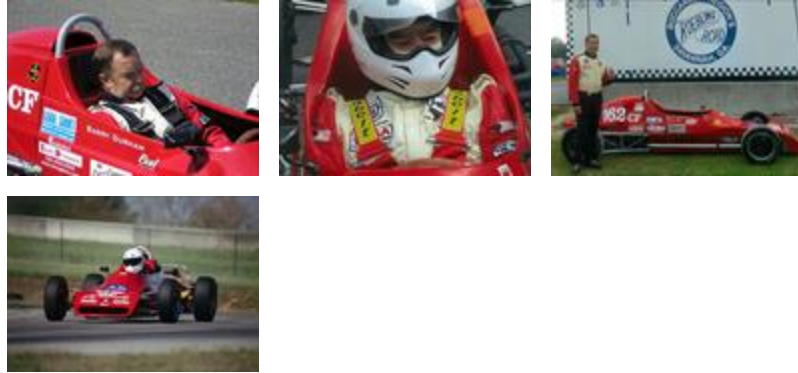
