We would sit there for hours and just catch fish off the pier. He would wake me up at 4:30 a.m. to go deer hunting in the woods. He would take our family on a summer vacation every year, so we could cherish the memories. He used his connections to get me summer jobs and my first job out of college. At my college graduation, he came out with me to the bar to toast my accomplishment, which I really enjoyed. He left for work every day at 5:30 a.m. and would get home at 6 p.m. to support our family, and he always had a smile on his face. A few years after my sister and I were out of the house living on our own, he suffered a stroke in 1995. This was the start of the second phase of his life. From that point on, instead of being the one that helped everyone else, he needed the help. However, he was a strong man. With the support of my mom and many caregivers, he received great love and care over many years while living at home. When my mom passed away in November, I saw my dad cry for the very first time. It showed how much he was going to miss her and miss the bond they had together. When he left us this week, I am sure he is now in a much better place. He is reunited with his wife. For those of you who knew him, either in the first or second phase of his life, you knew that he was an optimistic and caring man. For me, he was my one and only Dad, and I will forever miss him!*”
