Charles Robert Moll, 68, of 215-K Seminole Trail, Danville, VA, died Monday, September 15, 2014 at his residence after a decline in his health since 1990 from a long battle with COPD.

Mr. Moll was born in Philadelphia, PA, on April 25, 1946, a son of the late Charles H. Moll and the late Alice Gallagher Moll. He moved from Philadelphia, PA to Danville, VA in 1959 and graduated from George Washington High School. He retired from Walmart, due to disability, in 1990 where he had worked as Electronics Manager, and he was of the Methodist faith.

He was a veteran, serving in the U.S. Navy in Vietnam.

On October 30, 1980, he married Edith Wyatt Moll, who survives.
