



## Charlie Lester Hill Jr.

July 28, 1940 - June 13, 2020

Charlie Lester Hill, Jr., 79, of Ringgold, VA, went home to be with the Lord on Saturday, June 13, 2020, at Roman Eagle Rehab and Healthcare Center, after a decline in health for the past few years.

Mr. Hill was born in Pittsylvania County, VA, on July 28, 1940, a son of the late Charlie Lester Hill, Sr. and the late Cassie Kay Covington Hill. He lived all of his life in the Danville area where he owned and operated the Munford “Do It Yourself” Store. He served his country in the United States National Guard. He was a member of Central Boulevard Church of God.

On February 2, 1974, he married Patricia Clark Hill, who predeceased him on January 31, 2017.

He is survived by a daughter, Jennifer Hill Epps and husband Jonathan; two grandchildren, Nicholas and William Rekowski; and two sisters, Ruby Farlow and Peggy Johnson and husband David.

Funeral services will be held on Wednesday, June 17, 2020 at 12:00 PM from the Central Boulevard Church of God conducted by the Rev. John Meadows. Interment will follow in Highland Burial Park.
