Charlotte Lee Marshall Moon, 89, of Danville, VA, died Thursday, October 12, 2017 at Sovah – Danville, after a decline in health for the past several months.

Mrs. Moon was born June 22, 1928 in Danville a daughter of the late Charles Wesley Marshall and the late Emma Giles Marshall.
