Douglas Garfield Gammon, 93, of Danville went home to be with his Lord and Savior on Friday, January 13, 2023 after a brief illness.

Born in Pittsylvania County, VA on December 23, 1929, a son of the late Sam Henry Gammon and Thelma White Gammon.

On December 2, 1950, he married Carrie Lee Walker Gammon who predeceased him on June 28, 1998.

For many years he was the owner and operator of Doug Gammon Chainsaw and Lawnmower Repair. He was an active member of Hillcrest Baptist Church.

Survivors include a sister, Iris G. Searce, two sisters-in-law, Bette Keatts and Shirley Gammon, all of Danville. He is also survived by many nieces and nephews.

In addition to his wife he was predeceased by five brothers and one sister.
