Edward Milton Hardy, 77, of 389 Lakeside Drive, Danville, VA went home to be with the Lord on Monday, December 19, 2016 after being in declining health for the past two months.

Mr. Hardy was born in Danville, VA on March 25, 1939 a son to the late Jabe Hardy and Recie Mae Lewis Hardy. He had lived all of his life in Pittsylvania County and Danville, VA.
