Elizabeth Slate Liverman, 93, of Danville, VA, died Thursday, May 22, 2025 at Roman Eagle Rehabilitation and Health Care after a one year decline in her health.

Elizabeth was born in High Point, NC, a daughter of the late Thomas Alexander Slate and Onota Dickens Slate. She lived in Greensboro, NC before moving to Danville, VA in 1990. She was a homemaker.

Elizabeth was a member of North Main Baptist Church, where she was very active in serving the church in several capacities and committees before her health began to fail.

On March 23, 1959 she married Archie D. Liverman, Jr., who died on June 21, 1980.

In addition to her husband, she was predeceased by a sister, Judy S. Bailey.

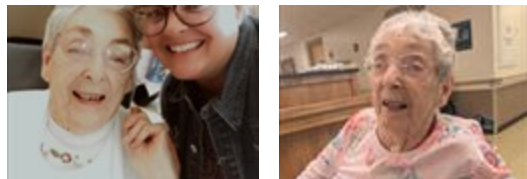
