April 8, 1930 - May 26, 2022

Frances Lee Dalton Farthing, 92, of Lakeside Drive, Danville, VA, went home to be with her Lord on Thursday, May 26, 2022 at Gretna Health and Rehab after being in declining health for several weeks.

Mrs. Farthing was born on April 8, 1930 in Pittsylvania County, VA, a daughter of the late Howard Petrose Dalton and Pearl Vassar Dalton. She spent all of her life in the Danville and Pittsylvania County areas, where she was a dietitian for Hughes Memorial Home until her retirement after 33 years of service. She was loved by all of the children at Hughes Memorial Home, and treated every child as if they were her own. She was a member of Afton Road Primitive Baptist Church. In her spare time, she enjoyed playing Skip-Bo.

On October 1, 1949, she married Sam Neal Farthing, Sr., who died on March 8, 2001.

In addition to her parents and husband, Mrs. Farthing was predeceased by her daughter, Brenda Kay Oakes; eleven brothers and sisters.

Survivors include her son, Sam N. "Sammy" Farthing, Jr. and his friend, Teresa Turner of Danville, VA.

She is also survived by her grandchildren, James Glenn Chesson, II
