George Rufus "Bean" Gregory, 65, of 4156 Whitmell School Road, Dry Fork, VA, passed away on Sunday, December 22, 2013 at Danville Regional Medical Center after a yearlong decline in his health.

"Bean" was born in Danville, VA on February 2, 1948, a son of the late Albert Burton Gregory and Marguerite Patterson Gregory. He was a lifelong resident of the Whitmell community of Pittsylvania County. He was a graduate of Tunstall High School and Danville Community College.
