George Carlton Pleasant, 90, of 630 Mt Cross Road, Danville, VA passed away on Thursday, April 19, 2018 at his residence.

He was born in Leasburg, NC, on February 13, 1928, a son of the late Malcom Monroe Pleasant and Lottie Stephens Pleasant Walker.

Mr. Pleasant worked for Holsum Bakery and was a farmer; he later retired from Dan River Mills.

He served in the US Army during the Korean Conflict. He was a member of Shermont Baptist Church.

On October 11, 1952, he married, Mildred Parsons Pleasant, who passed on October 3, 2013.

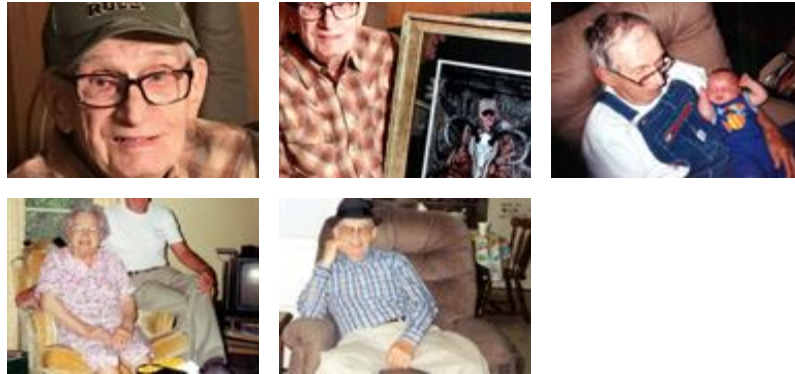
