Gregory William Jefferson, 71, of Danville, VA, died Friday, June 19, 2020 at Select Specialty Hospital in Greensboro, NC, after a decline in his health for the past three years.

Mr. Jefferson was born in Danville, VA, on October 2, 1948, a son of the late Gorris William Jefferson and Virginia Hopkins Jefferson. He lived most of his life in Danville, VA, and retired in 2006 from Medical Facilities of America as a Regional Maintenance Coordinator.

Gregory was of the Baptist faith. He was a member of the Danville Life Saving Crew and a member of the Disabled American Veterans. He was an avid fisherman, and enjoyed woodworking, gardening and NASCAR Racing. His favorite driver was Dale Earnhardt.

He was a veteran, proudly serving in the U. S. Army during the Vietnam War.
