Harry C. Moore Jr. Harry Carson Moore Jr., 77 of 1819 Glenn Street, Danville, VA passed away on Monday evening January, 2, 2012 at Piney Forest Health & Rehab. Center after a three year decline in health. Mr. Moore was born in Halifax County, VA on August 27, 1934 a son of the late Harry Carson Moore Sr. and Eula Jordan Moore. He had lived most of his life in Danville, VA where he had worked with Kroger's for 21 years prior to working with Norfolk Southern Railroad until his retirement with 27 years of service.
