January 16, 1919 - December 22, 2013

Hattie Davis Landrum, 94, of 1340 Orphanage Road died Sunday, December 22, 2013 at her residence after a decline in health for several years.

Born in Pittsylvania County, VA on January 16, 1919 a daughter of the late Benjamin Lloyd Davis and Cora Richardson Davis.

Mrs. Landrum worked as an Inspector for Dan River Inc. and was a Jehovah's Witness.

On October 24, 1936, she married, Charlie Howard Landrum, who died on April 2, 1993.
