



James "Jim" Nathan Lowe

October 31, 1944 - October 11, 2025

James "Jim" Nathan Lowe, 80, of the Whitmell Community, of Pittsylvania County, Virginia, went home to be with his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on October 11, 2025. He was born in Newport News, Virginia, on October 31, 1944, to the late Jim Henry Lowe and Hazel Wells Lowe. He moved to Danville, Virginia when he was three years old. Jim married the love of his life, Patricia Wallace Lowe, on June 12, 1965. He was preceded in death by his beloved wife, with whom he shared 54 cherished years of love, devotion, and faith.

Jim dearly loved his wife, and now they are reunited in heaven, rejoicing together in the presence of their Lord. The two faithfully served as leaders of the Shermont Baptist Church Decorating Committee, joyfully working side by side to make their church beautiful for the Lord—especially during Christmas, a season they both loved deeply.

Jim is survived by his daughter, Dr. Stephanie Lowe Ellis, and her husband, Christopher T. Ellis, both of Dry Fork, VA; two sisters, Ann Lowe Oughton (Sam) and Jennifer Lowe Orenic (Chuck); and was preceded in death by his brother, Stephen "Steve" Crawley Lowe.

He was a devoted husband, loving father, caring brother, and faithful servant of the Lord who lived a life marked by hard work, determination, and steadfast

faith.

A graduate of Virginia Tech in 1967 and Whitmell Farm Life High School in 1962. Jim began his career in education, teaching algebra and geometry at Tunstall High School from 1967 to 1972. He also taught at the Dan River Mills Adult Evening Education School from 1968 to 1969, where he shared his love of math and learning with many.

Jim began working in the heating and air conditioning trade at the young age of twelve alongside his father. His dedication and skill led him to become a partner in Lowe & Sons Heating and Air Conditioning, where he faithfully served the community for 62 years until his retirement in 2018. His work ethic, integrity, and commitment to excellence were evident in all that he did.

A faithful member of Shermont Baptist Church, Jim loved the Lord deeply. He was honored to sing in the Shermont Choir, serve as a Deacon, and contribute on numerous church committees. His church family was a great joy and source of fellowship throughout his life.

Jim was also active in many professional and civic organizations. He was a 50-year member of the Roman Eagle #122 Masonic Lodge. He served as Vice President (1996–1999), President-Elect (1998–1999), and State President (2000) of the Plumbing and Mechanical Professionals of Virginia (PMPV), where he was named Mechanical Contractor of the Year in 2000. He also served as Past President of the Danville-Pittsylvania Home Builders Association (1991–1993) and chaired its Legislative Committee. In addition, he served on the State Home Builders Legislative Committee and was Past President of the Danville-Pittsylvania Plumbing, Heating, and Cooling Contractors Association (1989–1991).

Jim was deeply committed to education in Pittsylvania County, serving on the

Citizens Advisory Committee (1994–1996) and the Vocational Advisory Committee from 1980 into the early 2000s. In recognition of his dedication to vocational education, he received numerous honors, including the Whole Village Award from the Pittsylvania Education Association in 1993 and 1997, and the Rufus W. Beamer Award of Excellence from the Vocational Education Association of Virginia in 2000.

In March 2001, he was appointed by Governor Jim Gilmore to the State Building Code Technical Review Board, where he continued to serve under Governor Mark Warner as well.

Outside of his many accomplishments, Jim loved spending time outdoors, especially enjoying golf and hunting. But above all, his greatest joys came from time spent with his family and serving the Lord he loved so dearly.

His life reflected one of his favorite scriptures, “Well done, good and faithful servant... enter into the joy of your Lord.” (Matthew 25:21)

A visitation will be held at Shermont Baptist Church on Wednesday, October 15, 2025 from 11:00 a.m. to 12:45 p.m., followed by a funeral service conducted by the Rev. Ryan Riley at 1:00 p.m. at Shermont Baptist Church. Masonic rites will be held at the church following the funeral service. Interment will follow at Danville Memorial Gardens. The family will also receive friends at his home in Dry Fork, Virginia. The family would like to thank the many friends and family who have offered support, encouragement, and love.

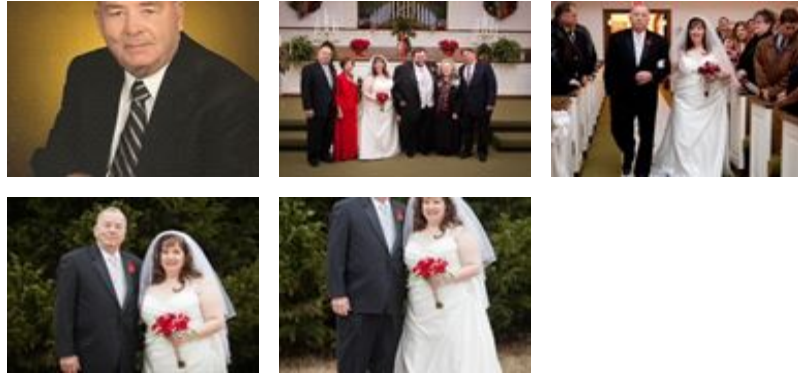
