Joseph Julian Slade, 80, passed away peacefully at Sovah Health, Danville, Virginia on July 3, 2024 after five months of declining health.

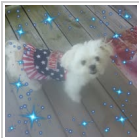

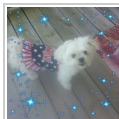
