Joy Turner Smith of 301 Northmont Blvd died on Sept. 23rd, 2019.

Joy was born to the late Claiborne & Mamie Turner of Keeling, Va. She grew up on a tobacco farm and worshipped at Oak Grove Baptist Church.

Graduated from Dan River High School, she was active in the student government and starred in basketball, winning a state championship.

She graduated from Memorial Hospital School of Nursing in Danville as a registered professional nurse and was honored as “The Best All Around Nurse” of her graduating class.

Joy met her husband of 59 years, Louis W. Smith, shortly after graduating while working at the hospital in the Ob-Gyn Dept.

Joy was active in her profession all her life. She worked as an office nurse for the late Dr. Clyde Lester Bailey, the Danville Health Department as a public health nurse for 5 years and gave the first flu shots to the Dan River Mill employees.

In 1975, she joined the staff at Roman Eagle Memorial Home and if you visited there you would've found her dispensing her joy and humor. She was
