Leonard Cecil McGuire "Chappy" 89, of Columbus, GA. passed away Friday, October 6, 2017 at St. Francis hospital.

Mr. McGuire was born September 16, 1928 in Pittsylvania County, VA. The son of Lonnie Andrew and Ruby Snead McGuire. He was brother to Herman McGuire, Raymond McGuire (deceased) and Pasty McGuire (deceased). Mr. McGuire was a retired LTC. Chaplain, served 23 years in the U.S. Army.
