Lewis Edward Graham, 94, of Danville, VA, went to be with his Lord and Savior on Thursday, December 15, 2016. He will celebrate his 95th birthday this Sunday in Heaven.

Born and raised in Danville, VA, he was the son of Talitha and Elbert Graham. He graduated from Schoolfield High School and studied accounting at Georgetown University. He served in the United States Army as an infantryman in World War II, earning a Bronze Star. In 1981, he started Eastern Panel Corporation. Upon selling the business in 1997, he continued to work there as a consultant until his death. He was a charter member of Christian Heritage Church and more recently attended North Main Baptist Church. Always passionate about Christian world missions, he supported missionaries throughout the world, including those in South America and Nepal.

Lewis was a faithful husband, wonderful father, and an amazing grandfather. A man known for his humility and generosity, he was a mentor to many, and advisor, and a loyal friend.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his first wife, Ida; sons, Tommy and Harry Graham; brothers, Herman, Claude, and Walter Graham; and sisters, Kathleen Crowder, Eva Owen, and Yeulie Mayhew.

He is survived by his wife, Jean Lowe Graham; son, Lewis E.
