August 1, 1925 - February 24, 2013

Lillie Mae Brown, 87, of Danville, VA died on Sunday, February 24, 2013 at Riverside Health Care after a decline in health for several months.

Mrs. Brown was born in Chatham, VA, on August 1, 1925, a daughter of the late George Willard Morrison and the late Lena Johnson Morrison. She lived all of her life in the Pittsylvania County and Danville area where she was a co-owner for the former Leon Cycle Shop for 39 years until her retirement. She was a member of Moffett Memorial Baptist Church where she was a member of the Dorcas Class, a former Sunday School teacher, choir member and a member of the Ladies Missionary Group. She was also a former member of the American Business Women's Association.

On June 19, 1944 she married Leon Taylor Brown who died on August 14, 1983.
