Lloyd Elmo Alderson, 91, of 2237 Birch Elmo Road South Boston, Virginia died Saturday, September 10, 2011 at the Danville Regional Medical Center.

He was born August 7, 1920 a son of the late Arthur C. Alderson and Anna Hymes Alderson. Mr. Alderson lived his entire life in Pittsylvania and Halifax Counties and was retired from the U.S.D.A. tobacco grading system and was also a farmer. He proudly served his country during World War II in the Army and was involved in the Battle of the Bulge in Bastogne, Belgium. Mr. Alderson was a member of the former Mount Zion Baptist Church and the Disabled American Veterans.

On December 24, 1946 he was married to the former Betty Boswell, who survives.
