Lois Gammon Sherrill, 72, of 452 Birkshire Drive, Danville, went home to be with her Lord on Monday, February 2, 2015 at Roanoke Memorial Hospital after being in declining health for the past two years.

She was born June 7, 1942 in Danville a daughter of the late Norman Oakes Gammon and the late Annie Mildred Moss Gammon and had lived all her life in Danville and Pittsylvania County. Mrs. Sherrill was a graduate of the former Danville Memorial Hospital School of Nursing. 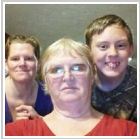
