October 16, 1920 - February 1, 2011

Mr. Louis Winston Shannon Sr., of 449 Clarkson Drive, Danville, VA passed away on Tuesday, February 1, 2011 peacefully at his residence.

Mr. Shannon was born in Lynchburg, VA on October 16, 1920 a son of the late Charles H. Shannon, Sr. and Dora Smith Shannon. He had lived most of his life in Danville area. Prior to his retirement he was an associate professor at Danville Community College. Mr. Shannon was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church where he was active with the Conley Bible Class. He served with the U.S. Navy during W.W. II.

On February 23, 1946 he was married to the late Marie York Shannon who died on August 31, 1996.

Mr. Shannon is survived by one daughter Anne S. Austin of Danville, VA, one son Louis W. Shannon Jr. of Richmond, VA, one brother Claude W. Shannon of Glen Mills, VA, four grandchildren and one great grandson. Mr. Shannon was predeceased by his wife, one brother Charles H. Shannon, Jr. and one grandson Cody C. Nifong.

The funeral will be conducted on Saturday, February 5, 2011 at 11:00 a.m. from the Graveside in Highland Burial Park by the Reverend Charles Wickham.
