Lucille Brannon Louhoff, 94, of 405 Lansbury Drive, Danville, VA, died Tuesday, December 3, 2013 at the Riverside Health and Rehabilitation Center after a decline in her health for the past year.

Born on November 18, 1919 in Danville, VA, she was the daughter of the late Arthur Fletcher Brannon and Mary Vaugan Brannon. She lived her entire life in Danville and retired from Dan River Mills where she had worked as a lab operator.
