Mable Claire Adams Slayton, 86, of Keeling, VA, died on Thursday, March 30, 2017 at The Orchard in Warsaw, VA after being in declining health for several years.

Mrs. Slayton was born on May 13, 1930 in Pittsylvania County, VA, daughter of the late Johnnie Fletcher Adams and Nannie Burnett Adams.
