



## Margaret McNichols

November 25, 1918 - June 25, 2011

Margaret Dodd McNichols, died on Saturday, June 25, 2011 in her home in Danville, with her daughter and son-in-law by her side. She had been in declining health for over ten months.

She was predeceased in 1996 by her husband Carl, her husband of nearly 57 years.

Margaret was born in the Witt community of Pittsylvania County, on November 25, 1918, the daughter of the late Claude Cleveland Dodd and Kate Evans Dodd.
