Nancy Walker Lee, 88, of 1208 Meadowview Drive, Danville, VA, died on Sunday, November 18, 2012 at Danville Regional Medical Center.

Mrs. Lee was born on February 16, 1924 in Franklin Co., VA a daughter of the late Johnny Milton Walker and the late Geneva Adkins Walker. She spent most of her life in the Danville, VA area where she worked as a weaver in Dan River Mills for forty years until her retirement.
