Norwood Hugh Powell, Sr., 88, of the Vandola community departed this life on Thursday, October 31, 2019 after a brief decline in health.

Norwood was born in Richmond, VA on January 10, 1931, a son of the late Alice Louise Powell Latham. Thomas Greenwood Powell and Mary Alice Hubbard Powell raised him.

Norwood served in the US Army and later retired from the Army Reserves with the rank of Major. He worked as an electrician for several Nuclear Power Plants. He was member of Westover Baptist Church and was an avid gardener with this past year being his best tomatoes.

On May 3, 1951, he married, Frances Hyler Powell, who survives of the residence.
