Pamela Kaye Parrish, 61, of New York, New York, died unexpectedly on Wednesday, July 20, 2022 at her residence.

Pamela was born in Danville, VA on April 21, 1961, a daughter of the late William Kermit Parrish and Ann Hodges Parrish. During her childhood she was a member of Northview Presbyterian Church (Unity Presbyterian Church). She graduated from Dan River High School Class of 1979 and went on to graduate from the University of Virginia in 1983 with her B.A. After obtaining her B.A., she graduated from Tulane University in New Orleans, LA in with a J.D in 1989.

After receiving her education, Pamela moved to New York, New York, in 1989, where she had currently worked as an Assistant General Counsel at JP Morgan Chase and Co. for many years. Pamela loved Manhattan and was a strong advocate of the city. She loved having out of town guests and showing people her city. She was active in a local book club, a supporter of animal rescues and she was very involved with politics where she would help friends with their election campaigns.

In addition to her mother, Ann Hodges Parrish, Pamela is survived by her sister, Brenda P. McGee of New Bern, NC.

A memorial service will be conducted on Friday, July 29, 2022 at 11:00 A.M. at the Wrenn-Yeatts Westover Chapel with the Reverend Jeffery Wright officiating. Inurnment will be held at a later date in Danville Memorial Gardens. The family will receive friends after the service at the funeral home.
