



## Paul Franklin Weaver

May 26, 1953 - April 30, 2018

Paul Franklin Weaver, 64, of 1718 Westover Dr., Danville, VA, died on Monday, April 30, 2018 at his residence due to complications from being hit by a drunk driver in 2015.

Mr. Weaver was born in Paxinos, PA, on May 26, 1953, a son of the late Warren F. Weaver and the late Mary Amanda Thomas Weaver. He lived in Amelia County, VA, where he worked for Gerdau Steel Mill. He had moved to Danville in 2017. In his spare time, he volunteered for Samaritan's Purse. He was of the Christian Faith. He will be remembered as a Godly man, an excellent family man, a hard worker, and as someone who was always helping others.

On June 9, 1972, he married the love of his life, Paula K. Weaver, who survives of the residence.

He is survived by his two daughters, Patricia Lobaugh-Weaver and Pamela Hoylman; five grandchildren, Travis Lobaugh, Joseph Lobaugh, Hunter Lobaugh, Brianna Hoylman, and Kayla Hoylman; three sisters, Mable Leinger, Sarah Latshaw, and Amanda Trometer; a brother, Jeremiah Weaver; and several nieces and nephews.
