Born in Meadows of Dan, VA, on November 24, 1924, he was the son of the late Daniel C. DeHart and Annie Alderman Dehart.

Pete was a long time resident of Pittsylvania County where he operated DeHart Brothers Lumber Company with brothers , G.D. and Carl. He was a member of Connors View Primitive Baptist Church in Meadows of Dan. He served his country in the U.S. Army during WWII in the Signal Corps in France, Germany, Italy, and North Africa from 1941-1945.

On December 30, 1956, he married Nelda Craddock DeHart, who died on February 11, 2007.

He is survived by his sister, Violet D. Holley, of Danville; and many nieces and nephews.

In addition to his wife, and parents, he was predeceased by three brothers, G.D., Carl, and Benjamin DeHart, and five sisters, Edna D. Bailey, Ethel D.
