Randolph Birks "Randy" Ingram, 88, beloved husband of the late Meryl Abbott Ingram passed away on November 7, 2008 in Roman Eagle Memorial Home after a decline health for several years. Mr. Ingram was born on February 25, 1920 in Pittsylvania County a son of the late Homer Lee Ingram and Manie Dix Ingram. He had lived all of his life in Pittsylvania County and Danville where he had retired in December of 1991 from the City of Danville Water & Gas Department with 19 years of service. He was predeceased in death by three sisters Geneva Ingram Davis, Mable Hilda Ingram and Barbara Ingram Brown, five brothers Lester Eller Ingram, Clarence Perry Ingram, Donald Miles Ingram, Willard Jackson Ingram and Melvin Smith Ingram.
