Robert Lee Ashworth, 95, of 221 Parkland Drive, Danville, VA died on Wednesday, March 19, 2014 at Riverside Health and Rehabilitation Center after being in declining health for several years.

Mr. Ashworth was born on March 2, 1919 in Pittsylvania County, VA a son of the late Willie Henry Ashworth and the late Hattie Cassada Ashworth. He lived all of his life in the Danville area where he owned and operated Ashworth Florist. He proudly served in the United States Army in WWII and he was a member of Mt Olivet United Methodist Church.
