



## Roy Barrett

November 3, 1924 - May 25, 2013

Roy Barrett, age 88, of 4002 Pittwood Drive, Danville, Virginia died Saturday, May 25, 2013 at Chatham Health and Rehab Center after a decline in health since February.

Born in Huntersville, TX, he was a son of the late Hubert Redding Barrett and Maggie Alphin Barrett.

Mr. Barrett spent his most of his life in Texas retiring from Brown & Root where he was an Instrumentation Engineer and then he moved to Danville in 1984. He served in the U.S. Navy during WWII, and was a member of Hunters Lodge # 156 A.F. & A.M. On December 30, 1948, he married Evelyn Rowland Barrett, who predeceased him.
