



Ruth Baker Hopkins

January 11, 1923 - October 22, 2014

Ruth Baker Hopkins, 91, formally of 843 Hughes Street, Danville, VA, died on Tuesday, Oct. 22, 2014 in Magnolia TX, after being in declining health for several months.

Mrs. Hopkins was born on Jan. 11, 1923 in Cleveland, GA the daughter of the late Robert Lester Baker and the late Anna Myrtle Edwards Baker. She spent her adult life in the Danville area where she began working at Dan River Inc. in '3 Dress' in 1942 and continued on until her retirement in 1985. She was a member of Southall /Westover Baptist Church from 1943 until the present and worked with the Junior Girls Sunday School Class. She was an admired seamstress.

On Dec. 6, 1958 she married Julius (Hop) Waddell Hopkins who died on Feb. 23, 2002. She was predeceased by son, Larry Baker and brothers, Frank and James Baker.

She is survived by brothers, Buford Baker, and Corbett Baker; sisters Fannie Baker, Ellen B. Gunnells and Lula B. Moss; granddaughter Phyllis "Penny" Baker Gunn, husband Raine and her great-grandchildren Natalie, Elijah and Levi Gunn now of Magnolia, TX.

Survivors also include step son Julius W. Hopkins, Jr. and his wife Karen of

Lynchburg, VA; step grandchildren Catherine Hopkins and Julia Vitale; honorary grandchildren Armando Labiosa, James Labiosa and Maria Labiosa Garcia.

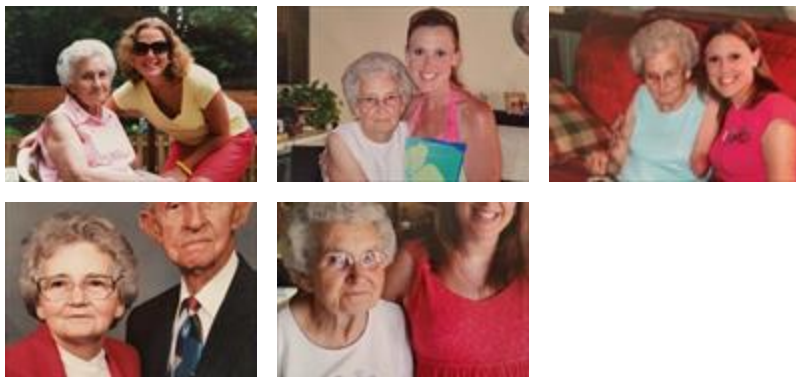
