



Ruth Snead Yeatts

September 22, 1921 - December 11, 2017

Ruth Snead Yeatts, 96, of Clement Ave., Danville, VA, died on Monday, December 11, 2017 at Carilion Roanoke Memorial Hospital after a decline in health for the past year.

Mrs. Yeatts was born in Sutherlin, VA on September 22, 1921, a daughter of the late Luther B. Snead and the late Susie McGregor Snead Myers. She spent most of her life in the Danville area where she worked for Sears Department Store. She was a member of Rivermont Baptist Church.

On April 20, 1951, she married Edward Thomas Yeatts, Sr., who died in August of 1994.
