Thomas Wayne Arthur, 81, of 1460 Dodson Rd, Blairs VA went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, November 22, 2020 at Sovah Health after being in declining health for the last few months.

Thomas was born in Danville, VA on February 15, 1939, son of the late James Thomas Arthur and Alice Blanch Rakes Arthur. Thomas proudly served his country in the United States Air Force and obtained rank of Captain. He went on to receive two Bachelors of Science Degrees, one in engineering and the other in mechanical engineering and then went on to get his Masters in engineering all at Virginia Tech. After college, Thomas owned and operated Danville Communication Center. He had previously owned, Piedmont Fire and Security and Danville Telephone Services.

Thomas was an active member of the community, he was a member of the German Club, VA Tobacco Commission, Danville Golf Club, and he was chairman of the Pittsylvania County Republican Committee for over 19 years. He attended West Main Baptist Church.

On June 15, 1991 he married Brenda Sledd Arthur who survives of the residence.

In addition to his wife, Thomas is survived by daughter, Mary Elizabeth Arthur

Hill of Danville, VA; son, James Penn Arthur and wife Jenny of Catawba, VA; and granddaughter, Rachel Marie Hylton of Danville, VA.

He was predeceased by his first wife, Mary Lee Penn Arthur; a sister, Wanda Marie Arthur Brooks; and brother, William Thomas Conner.

Funeral services will be conducted on Friday, November 27, 2020 at 11:00 a.m. at the Wrenn-Yeatts Westover Chapel with the Reverend Wade Rowland officiating. Interment will follow the service in Highland Burial Park with military honors conducted by the United States Air Force and the American Legion Dan River Post 1097.

“ *It is with a heavy broken heart that I tell you of the passing of my father, Thomas W. Arthur, 81.*

My dad was a remarkable man, with a lifetime of accomplishments that are more numerous than I can barely all remember, as they all flood back into my mind today, and I marvel at the depth in awe, pride and love.

Born in Danville, Virginia in 1939, the son of James Thomas and Blanche Arthur, he was a bright and meticulously driven student. He was a musician, he was an athlete. He was an integral part of his high school basketball team (was a dead-eye free throw shooter, with an amazing 68% from the stripe) and a very good piano player, having taken piano lessons at an early age. He later taught himself to play guitar as well.

He was an absolutely amazing big brother to an adopted little sister, Wanda Arthur Brooks (RIP). They were incredibly close.

Dad was a Virginia Tech Hokie through and through. He entered Virginia Polytechnic Institute in 1957, into the ROTC Corps of Cadets program, rising to the rank of Cadet Lieutenant Colonel and Squadron Commander by the time he graduated with a degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1961. He was a member of the German Club at Virginia Tech, he was a member of the National Arnold Air Society, he was a member of the National Scabbard and Blade Society.

Dad was commissioned into the United States Air Force as a 2nd Lieutenant, serving at Hickam Air Force Base in Honolulu, Hawaii.

Dad was Honorably Discharged in 1965. He returned to Virginia Tech for two additional degrees, a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering, and a Master's of Electrical Engineering. Dad worked for Lockheed Aircraft Manufacturing Corp in Georgia, with his principal duties being in communication systems

engineering and design for the massive C5-A Galaxy military transport plane.

He road motorcycles at that time, and survived a motorcycle accident that ended his interests on a street bike.

He, along with my late mother, became heavily interested in American Saddlebred show horses, and began to ride and show. After moving back to the Danville area, and Pittsylvania County, they established a show horse farm and American Saddlebred horse breeding enterprise.

At one point, my parents and my sister were extremely active in showing American Saddlebreds, and we had upward of 50 horses on our farm, headlined by two nationally known bloodlined breeding stallions.

My father also built numerous small businesses from scratch, in the telecommunications and fire and security industries, and has been a successful small business man in Danville for over 50 years of his working life.

My father was also a private pilot. Having a lifelong affinity for flying, but never having the razor sharp eyesight needed to do it as an Air Force pilot, he became a private pilot and thoroughly enjoyed pleasure flying.

My father built his own airplane, almost entirely from scratch. Started with a set of plans and a tube-welded frame. It was an open-cockpit bi-wing acrobatic single seater. He built the plane over the course of a multi-year hobby project, and successfully flew it.

Not many are lucky enough to say the following: he survived a plane crash. He survived crashing landing the bi-wing acrobatic plane. A malfunction in his gas line and fuel pump caused him to lose all engine power at no more than 300 feet altitude, and he successfully emergency crash landed it, and walked away from the crash

and walked away from the crash almost unscathed. He later repaired the plane back to new, and flew it again before selling it. In his later years, he was very active in local politics in the Danville and Pittsylvania County area, serving on the Danville Tobacco Commission as well as other political endeavors to better his home area.

He has followed Virginia Tech sports with a passion for literally decades. Easily from the 70's on, through all the good and all the bad. The number of great memories I have of VT sports with him are seemingly infinite.

He is without a doubt the reason I am a Hokie. And I thank him for that every day.

I could write a book on the lessons he taught me, and the very important life knowledge I gained from having him as my dad. I will love and miss him forever. I appreciate you reading about his life.

I love you Pop. Until we meet again.
