



## Virginia Hudson Hughey

February 13, 1926 - April 5, 2014

Virginia Hudson Hughey, 88, of 173 Lynndale Drive, Danville, VA passed away on Saturday, April 5, 2014 at her home. She had been in declining health since August of 2013.
