Walter Lea Thomas IV, 61, of Milton, NC died January 24, 2021 at Hospice Home in Burlington, NC after a courageous battle with cancer.

Walter Lea is the son of Marian Thompson Thomas, of Milton, and the late Walter Lea Thomas III. In addition to his mother, he is also survived by his wife, Julie McSherry Thomas, son Walter "Lea" Thomas V of Winston-Salem, NC, brother Marc C. Thomas (Diane), sisters Marilea Thomas Compton and Elizabeth Thomas Pressley (Robert/"Bo"), sister-in-law Ginny McSherry Foster (Andy), numerous nieces, nephews, great nieces, and nephews.

Walter Lea was born March 21, 1959 in Danville, VA. Walter Lea was a graduate of George Washington High School and Appalachian State University where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Business. He was a member of the Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity. He was currently employed as a Real Estate Reviewer for the Department of Transportation in Winston-Salem, NC. Walter Lea was a retired volunteer fireman and active member of Milton United Methodist Church. He served on Milton's town council and as its mayor for two terms.

Due to COVID-19, a private celebration of his life will be conducted on Saturday, January 30, 2021, with the Reverend John Upton and Reverend Adam Benson officiating. A celebration of life for friends will be conducted at a

later date.

“First, I want to share my deepest sympathies with Walter Lea’s family. I know he will be missed greatly but also know that he left a great deal of optimism with each of those he touched. I wish you only the happiest of memories and to share some of mine.

I moved from Bethesda MD to Milton in June of 1969 when my mother, Nancy Hankins Scott, remarried Mr. George L. Scott of Milton. It was a big environmental and cultural shift for me, my brother Tony Sylvester and, to a lesser extent (just due to her young age), my sister Pam Sylvester Kilpatrick. I have previously credited Mr. John Scott and his wife Mrs. Jean Scott with introducing these “yankee” kids to the Milton community in an incredibly positive light. I feel this paved the way for our acceptance by and integration into our new community. I mention this because Uncle John and Aunt Jean influenced positive opinions in the adult population on our behalf. This is not the whole story and what I share now is another particularly important part of this memory that I have inexplicably failed to share previously.

Now, I must mention that my mother and Mrs. Marian Thomas were old college friends from their time together at Randolph-Macon Woman’s College (now Randolph College) in Lynchburg, VA. As a result, some of the first “new friends” we developed in the summer of 1969 included both Marc and Walter Lea Thomas. I do not know if or how much Mrs. Marian Thomas might have influenced her sons to be congenial with the new transplants, but I never sensed that either was influenced to behave in any way that did not come naturally. Marc was a year ahead of me in school and took more of the teacher role, enlightening me as to the customs and activities in our new community. Walter Lea was in the same grade as Tony and was more inquisitive regarding the customs and activities in Bethesda. He eagerly pointed out those which would need modification (or dismissal) if we were to get along in our new community. The Thomas family introduced us to the world of Hyco Lake, including boating and water skiing, and entertained us at their house there.

One of the scariest things about our relocation was entering school in late summer when we knew almost no one, but we did know a very few. I must now credit both Marc and Walter Lea with helping to pave way for our acceptance by and integration into our new school community as they influenced positive opinions in that environment.

Lastly, I want to mention that it is clear to me in hindsight that Mrs. Marian Thomas also deserves a great deal of credit and thanks for introducing the “yankee” kids to the Milton community in a positive light. Thanks to my late mom for building and maintaining such a meaningful friendship that eventually benefitted her children when they really needed it.

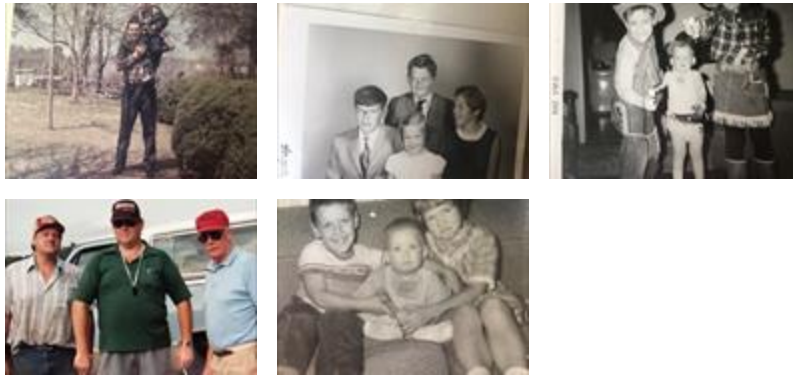
