



William "Billy" Coleman Holley, Sr.

William "Billy" Coleman Holley, Sr., 79, of Dry Fork, VA, passed away on Tuesday, August 23, 2022, at his home after a decline in his health for the past two years.

Billy was born in Danville, VA on October 17, 1942, a son of the late Henry Coleman Holley and Margaret Lucille Holley.

He spent his life in the Dry Fork and Danville area and operated Holley Moving Company. He was a dedicated member of Gods Pit Crew since 2008, where he founded the God's Pit Crew Fuel Fund. He was an avid fisherman and enjoyed motorcycle rides.

Billy was married to Erma Jean Holley on March 14, 1964. They were married for 58 years.

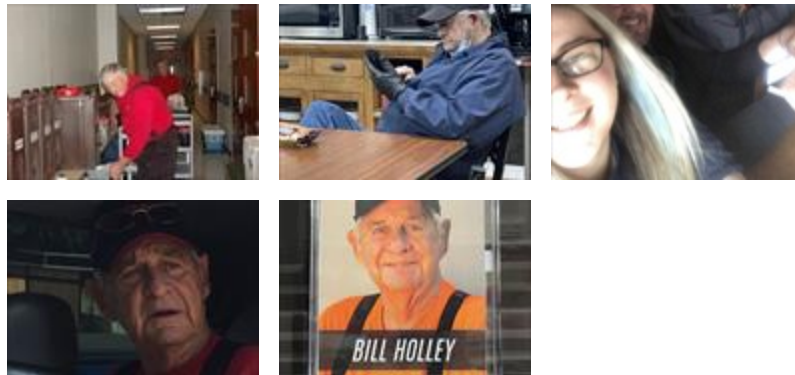
