William Matthew “Bill” Browe, 67 of 245 Forest Road Drive, Danville, VA died early in the morning hours of November 3, 2015 after being in declining health for the past several years.

Bill was born on December 10, 1947 in Washington, DC a son of the late James D. Browe and Margaret Williams Browe. He was a graduate of the Massanutten Military Academy and also a graduate of Liberty Baptist College, now Liberty University with a major in Communications Media. Bill had lived in different areas of Virginia prior to moving to Danville in 1982 where he retired from Comcast as Production Manager after 32 years of service. Bill also produced and televised Danville’s March of Dimes Telethon for many years. He was a member of Trinity United Methodist Church where he served on the Evangelism committee and he was leader of the newly formed prayer study group on Tuesday mornings.

On January 9, 2010 Bill married Kathy Jones Browe who survives of the residence. He is also survived by one son Christian Browe & wife Lisel of Forrest, VA, one step daughter Christy Case Stream & husband Tim of Greensboro, NC, five grandchildren Graham, Christian, Jean Browe and Evan & Christopher Stream, three brothers James Browe, Jr. of Bedford, VA, Andrew Browe & wife Paula of Indiana, PA, Conrad Browe & wife Jane of Newport News, VA, his mother in law Evelyn Jones of Danville, VA and two special companions Journey & Oreo.

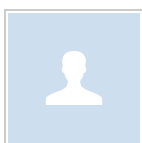
