102 years of faith and prayer were rewarded Sept. 14 when Wilmoth Marshall slipped peacefully away to join her Heavenly Father. Surely her husband of 60 years, Robert (who made the journey in April 1993) was one of the first to greet her, eager to show her around. Born June 07, 1914, Wilmoth lived her entire life in Danville. She retired in 1979 from Pittsylvania County Schools as cafeteria manager at Glenwood Elementary school. In her spare time she raised a family, was the bookkeeper for her husbands plumbing business, and taught Sunday school for 65 years at Glenwood Memorial Baptist Church where she was a member since she was nine years old. In addition to her husband, she was predeceased by her son Robert Edward Marshall Jr. of Halifax and his wife Joyce. She is survived by her daughter Lucy Dawn Adkins, grandchildren Steve Adkins (Ringgold), Deanna Adkins Young (Keeling), Tammy Marshall (Halifax), and Michael Marshall (Halifax). 7 great grandchildren and 2 great great grandchildren.
